Director's Note

So many people contributed so much to creating tonight's musical story of Pippin – skills, talents, aptitudes, time, and, yes, money!

When that happens, you can expect a lot of other stories to get told, too. Stories of aspiration, loss, challenge, crisis, triumph.

So which of these stories is best to share with you in this space? The story to tell is always the one about love.

Love is, after all, creative and harsh, demanding and

forgiving, solid and sticky, liberating and terrorizing, crazy and grounding. We found all that and more in Pippin.

The Beginning: At the point of auditions, I asked everyone, Why do you want to be in this show? For each person, the answer was love: I love this show! I love these songs! I love this theatre! I love these players, these characters, these people!

The Work: At significant stops along the way, I encouraged everyone – cast and crew – to think about how we show love to making a musical. How can you show love to the story (hint: know your lines and speak them with efficiency and clari-ty...!)? How will you show love to the players and to the crew, your fellow collaborator on the team? This is going to be hard work, how will you show love to your own self? To your families who are missing the time with you? To the friends who encourage you? To those who long to be with you while you are here?

I think that, because we all worked to keep love at the center, performers felt encouraged to contribute ideas, feedback, personal observations, and – best of all – questions! And for all this, I love that this is our show!

Tonight: So! Here we are! Because this is live theatre, we are all excited to see how we show love to you, our audience, and – always, always – to each other.

It's impossible to talk about love without thinking about gratitude. A whole lot of people showed love to ACT and to Pippin. The cast joins me in thanking our show sponsors, HomeTrust Bank and Dr. Elizabeth N. Huddleston. Their generosity inspires! Thanks also to our amazing friends at Asheville Aerial Arts who showed us how to let our dreams climb and fly and tumble and spin with safety and joy!
